



Queen Water Main Replacement Project

A WSSC PROJECT IS COMING TO YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD! WSSC maintains more than 11,000 miles of water and sewer mains across Montgomery and Prince George's counties and is actively working investing in its aging infrastructure. In keeping our commitment to providing our customers with reliable water and wastewater service we are renewing our aging infrastructure at an annual pace of 61 miles of water mains and 20 miles of sewer main, more than the national average.

Scope of Work

- WSSC will be replacing approximately 1.95 miles of water mains with new ductile iron pipe, which will reduce the frequency of water main breaks.
- WSSC will replace the portion of the water service line between the public main and the property line connection, at no cost to you.

Estimated Project Schedule

The estimated project schedule for the Queen Water Main Replacement Project as denoted below is based on preliminary design and construction schedule. **These dates may change based on issuance of permit, contracts or inclement weather.**

- Estimated construction start: May 2018
- Estimated construction duration: Spring 2019

WHAT TO EXPECT

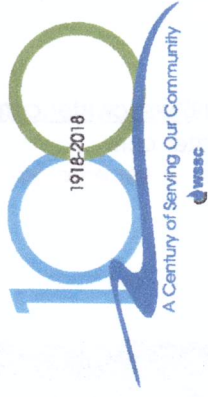
- New water mains will be installed using an open-cut construction method, which involves constructing a trench by cutting and excavating a section of the pavement. This construction method does create noise and dust. This type of work is typically done during the day unless otherwise required as a condition of the work permit.
- Above-ground (bypass) pipes may be installed to maintain water service to your home. These pipes will be placed along the roadway edge and provide the same quality of water to your home.
- Smaller pipes will connect these temporary water mains to your home.

IMPACTS

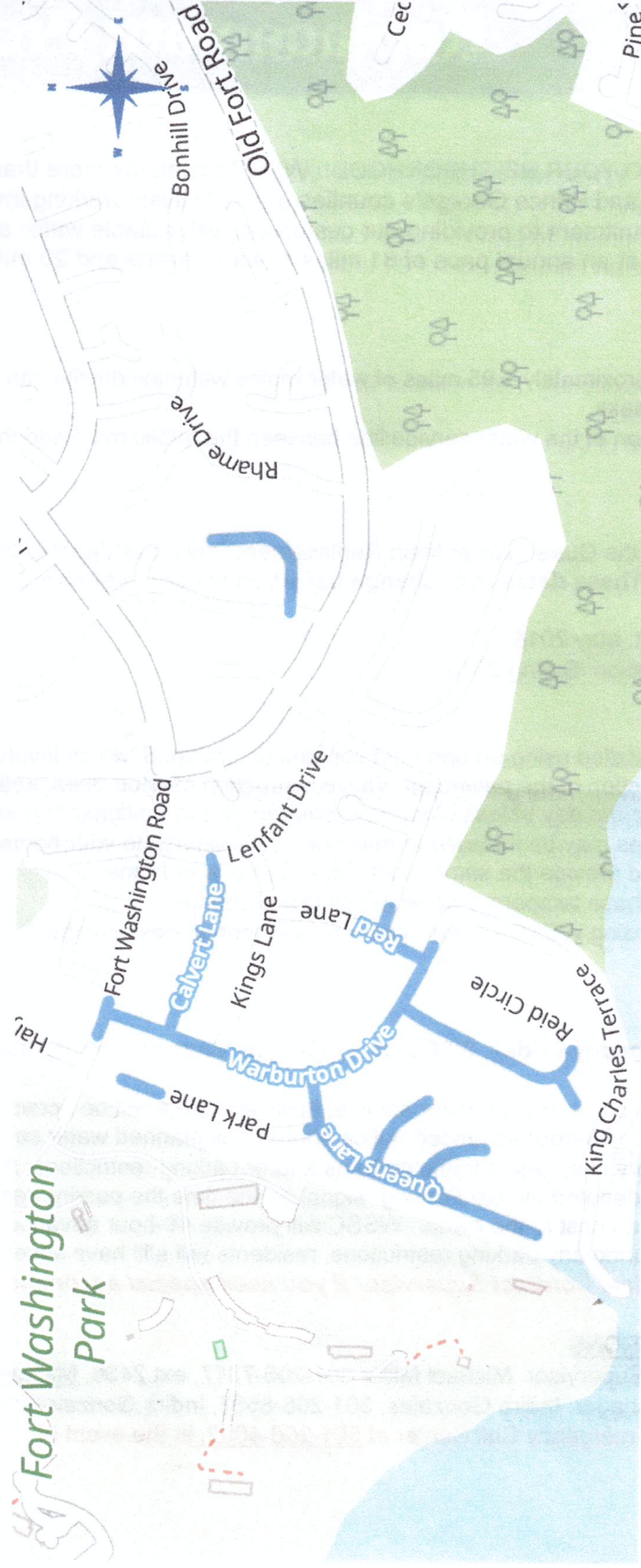
- Anticipated Work Hours: **Monday-Friday, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.** Work may occasionally extend beyond these hours to complete specific tasks.
- WSSC works to minimize impacts to your water service, however, there will be occasions when your water service is disrupted. WSSC will provide 48-hour advanced notice prior to any planned water service interruptions.
- There also may be temporary changes to traffic patterns and/or parking restrictions. Any vehicles that have not been removed from the area (as denoted by "No Parking" signs) by the time the parking restrictions take effect will be towed to a nearby street at no cost to the owner. WSSC will provide 48-hour advance notice prior to any parking restrictions. Please note, during any parking restrictions, residents will still have access to your homes.
